Observations:

- Age bracket for eligible students now stands approximately between 58 and 79
- · Despite prior marketing efforts, number of participants continues to decline annually
- A low percentage of applicants are approved and a lower percentage actually enroll
- Average expenditure over past three years has been approximatel / \$67,000
- Expense increased in 2015-16 due to students transitioning to graduate work
- Already legally settled that the scholarship cannot extend to legacy
- If every current student continues through to the doctoral program, it would take about 7-10 years of near full-time enrollment

Questions / Considerations:

- Have prior marketing efforts reached all those who are interested? Or another way of looking at it... has sufficient opportunity been provided over the past 11 years?
- Need to reserve a reasonable amount of funds for those currently enrolled to complete education goals
 - o Unknown how much it will cost to assist students in completing their degree goals... what is their degree aspiration, which college will they attend, how much will tuition cost in 3, 5, or 10 years?
- · What is the long-term obligation to any new students entering the program?
- Longevity of program depends upon the tuition costs for participants to fulfill their education aspirations and the number of students in the program. We are rapidly approaching - or at - the point at which new students will need to be cautioned on how far the Brown v Board of Education Scholarship Program can assist them in their educational goals.
- What are the measures of program success:
 - o The existence of the program is a success in itself as an acknowledgement of local and state government culpability in denying education through school closures
 - Each participant should be considered a success
 - o How many participants have completed a degree program? How many of each?
